

We've been in a series about the last week of Jesus' life. It began in the upper room with the Last Supper. What started as a traditional Seder ended with Jesus putting himself on the table in place of the sacrificial lamb. He said, "This is my body given for you. This is my blood poured out for you." Jesus set us free from sin. He promises his followers a new covenant. We are reminded of that gift when we celebrate Holy Communion.

In the Garden of Gethsemane Jesus prayed in agony. He persisted in his prayer and said, "Not my will, but your will be done." He showed us the kind of strength that we can gain should we take everything to God in prayer.

The religious people that should have loved Jesus the most captured him, shackled him, and tried him. The chief priest and scribes were saying that Jesus claimed to be the King of the Jews. That charge was punishable by death. Jesus is taken to the governor's mansion. Jesus comes face-to-face with Pontius Pilate. Two kingdoms are about to collide: Jerusalem and Rome. Pontius Pilate is stuck in the middle.

The chief priest took Jesus into the courtroom. Pilate would be forced to either affirm Jesus' claim of being King of the Jews or deny that Jesus was the Messiah. Since Caesar was the King of the Jews, Jesus would be killed. Historians described Pontius Pilate as unmovable. No one could force his hand or tell him what to do. He was harsh and stubborn. He had tremendous power. He was a politician in total control of the situation. He had the power to control Jesus' fate, whether Jesus would live or die.

When Pilate questions Jesus, Jesus refuses to defend himself. Pilate has to do something, but this situation doesn't feel right. He is trying to rid himself of the problem. He picks a notorious evil prisoner, places him beside Jesus, and allows the crowd to decide which one they will release. Barrabas is ushered into the courtroom. Pilate gives the crowd a choice to free Jesus or Barrabas. The chief priest riles up the crowd to say give us Barrabas.

Pilate miscalculates the outcome. Then Pilate's wife had a dream that said, "You need to be clean of this man. You need to stay away from this innocent man. Run the other direction." Pilate was looking for a way out, but ignores his wife.

Many people want to exonerate Pilate of any guilt. They mention the crowd yelled, "Crucify Him!" This was not a democracy. Pilate was in the sole position of authority. He was the governor of the strongest empire. No one could force his hand. After he makes the decision he wants to make himself clean. He is looking for forgiveness because he knows he is doing the wrong thing. He knows the right thing because he received a divine revelation.

Pilate chooses to do wrong. In that instant we realize that Pilate is like every one of us. Just like Pilate we can't stop doing the things we don't want to do. The difference between Pilate and us is that we can rejoice that Christ can save us, cleanse us, and wash us. Pilate could only turn to a bowl of water. As Pilate washed his hands, I can imagine his wife walking away sobbing. She may have hummed that song, "What Can Wash Away My Sin? Nothing, but the Blood of Jesus." She knew.

When do we turn to something other than the grace of Jesus to get out of a situation? When have we looked to something other than the grace of Jesus to find our salvation, rescue, or our hope? When in our lives have we turned our backs on Jesus? When the chips are down will Jesus still be able to count on me?

Becoming deeply committed Christians begins when we do the same things that Christ did and live sacrificially. That means living lives of service. It means getting involved the best you can when you don't think you have enough time to give. Nothing we do can make God love us anymore; nothing we do can make God love us any less. We give out of gratitude for what he has done in our lives. That is Christ's call on our lives. Do you get it?

Let's pray. Gracious Lord, thank you for the continued opportunities that you give us to live faithfully in the world. We give you thanks. We pray that you will fill us with the spirit that will enable us to believe that we can do all things because of your grace. Bless us today. Renew our souls and our spirits so we don't turn our backs on you when the chips are down.

Help us to be sacrificial in our giving. Help us to live lives of grace that that we might become ambassadors of hope and light to the world. Help us to collectively live in community to change the world. Amen.
